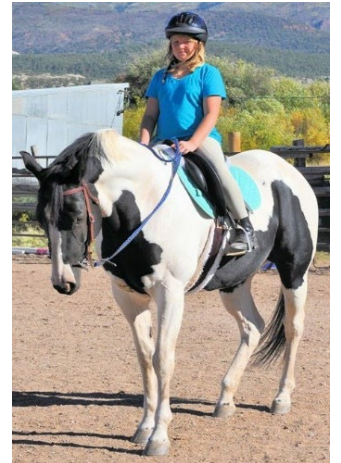

The Details:

Safety and Dress Requirements:

- ◆ SEI/ATSM Certified Horseback Riding Helmet
- ◆ Paddock Boots, Tall Boots or Cowboy Boots – No Tennis Shoes
- ◆ Jodhpurs, Breeches, running leggings, or Slim-Fit, Stretchy Jeans – No Shorts
- ◆ T-shirts, long-sleeved shirts, or polos – No Tank Tops



Each child should bring a sack lunch, snacks, a plastic water bottle and sunscreen to camp every day.

A waiting list will be maintained, if needed.

The Fine Print:



Any camper not meeting the above safety and requirements will be sent home and registration fees will not be refunded.

If assistance is needed in finding a SEI/ATSM Certified Horseback Riding Helmet, please contact Annie at amorris@cordillerametro.org prior to camp attendance.

Cancellation Policy: When we reserve your space for the summer, we often turn other families away and are unable to fill that space later. Therefore, no daily cancellations or changes are allowed. A \$100 deposit per program is nonrefundable and non-transferable. 2023 Cancellation Deadline: On or before 5/16/23: Forfeit \$100 deposit/week. Cancellations must be made in writing and emailed to: info@cordillerametro.org.

CEC Horse Program Rules:

1. Proper riding attire is required. This includes boots with smooth bottoms and heels, horseback riding approved riding helmet, and long pants.
2. Helmets are available on a limited basis. A helmet must be purchased if participating in horse camp.
3. All students **MUST WEAR A HELMET WHEN RIDING OR ON THE GROUND AROUND HORSES.**
4. Drinks must be in a plastic bottle, no glass bottles at the facility.
5. Do not touch or feed any horse without your instructor's consent.
6. Do not enter any stall or paddock without your instructor present, unless instructed to do so by your instructor.
7. Do not run up to or walk closely behind a horse. Keep at least 15 feet back to avoid getting kicked.
8. No dogs allowed at the barn.
9. No loose or unattended small children, this can frighten horses and can cause an accident.
10. You are responsible for children who are on the property and not in lessons.
11. All paperwork including a liability waiver must be filled out and submitted before the first day of camp.
12. Please make sure children are prepared to focus, listen, and learn. Horses are large animals that can unintentionally cause great harm. Safety is the priority. If an individual is unable to listen and follow instructions, then they may not be ready for horseback riding lessons and will be sent home.
